ABOUT THE COURSE

*Integrated Mathematics III provides opportunities for students to help develop strong critical thinking skills by giving them the applications and technology needed to foster an appreciation of mathematics. This course will show students how mathematics can be applied to their everyday lives in interesting and meaningful ways. **Please keep in mind that Integrated Mathematics III is in essence a Liberal Arts college course and will be taught accordingly.***

SUGGESTED SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS

- mechanical pencil (extra lead) and/or 3 sharpened pencils and loose leaf paper and/or 3-ring binder and/or notebook
- scientific calculator /if you are going to purchase one, then I recommend the TI-30XS MultiView

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS /RESPONSIBILITIES

- enter the classroom quietly /be in assigned seat prepared to work by the time that the start-of-class tardy bell rings
- take notes /copy teacher worked-out problems /work out class-assigned student practice problems in your notebook
- do daily classwork assignments, group activities, technology activities, etc -**SHOWING ALL WORK** /if a calculator is used, **WRITE** down calculator keys pressed
- stay focused and on task **ALL** period /raise hand and wait to be called on to speak -do not call out at any time
- participate in the learning process and take an active part in each day's lesson /do the **ONUS*** on a daily basis
- if no specific home assignment is given, then the class assignment(s) becomes the **ONUS**

**ONUS implies -that you a) remain focused and on task, taking full responsible to learn each day's class lesson, b) take notes in class, c) practice and review worked-out examples copied in class and from your textbook, d) do home assigned exercises from the textbook and/or worksheets, as well as additional exercises that you deem necessary, e) ask questions in class on exercises where you need help, f) use available textbook resources and other resources to help with your understanding of course content that you do not understand. Always keep in mind that you are responsible for everything that is taught/discussed in class as well as the content of textbook sections covered in class.*

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

- NO EATING AND/OR DRINKING**, except for water, in class /keep desk area and room clean... put trash in a trash can
- follow the School Board of Broward County Core Values... cooperation, responsibility, citizenship, kindness, respect, honesty, self-control, and tolerance
- follow classroom rules and procedures, Monarch High School rules and procedures, and School Board of Broward County Code of Student Conduct rules, procedures, and policies
 - keep all electronic devices (ipods, cell phones, etc) visibly out of sight and audibly not heard
- you will be **held accountable for your actions**

ABSENT STUDENT EXPECTATIONS /RESPONSIBILITIES -take make-up within allowed time, even if absence is yet to be excused

- if absent, you are responsible to check Mrs Mollet's web page to see the day's classwork and assignments missed
 - it is your responsibility to learn the course material taught /discussed, get the notes, etc -this is your **ONUS**
 - any test missed needs to be taken on the first school day that Mrs Mollet stays **after school**, within two school days of your return not including the day of return (2 days allowed for each excused absence), **OR**
 - in class** within two school days of your return not including the day of return (2 days allowed for each excused absence) with the understanding that you accept responsibility for learning the course material taught /discussed on this day, on your own -this is your **ONUS**
- NOTE:** a make-up test grade may **ONLY** be entered in teacher grade book if absence day(s) is excused

FIELD TRIP FORMS will **NOT** be approved if Mrs Mollet believes that it is in your best interest to be in class and not be absent, you are failing, or you are in danger of failing.
